MARK

LANULA DV

This gospel was written by Mark in AD 55. Mark looks at Jesus' life through what he did. He often portrays Jesus as a servant. Watch for Mark's use of the word "immediately" and his focus on Jesus' miracles.

Read each passage slowly. Ask God to speak to you from His Word. Read the passage a second time. Then ask:

- → What is this passage about?
- → What does it tell me about Jesus?
- → How did Jesus interact with people?
- → What does God want me to do as a result of reading this passage?

LUKE

This gospel was written by Luke to a Greco-Roman audience between AD 59-63(ish). Luke portrays Jesus' life through how He *feels*. As you read, notice how Luke emphasizes Jesus' humanity and His role as a teacher. Watch for his use of the phrase "Son of Man" and his focus on the parables.

Read each passage slowly. Ask God to speak to you from His Word. Read the passage a second time. Then ask:

- → What is this passage about?
- → What does it tell me about Jesus?
- → How did Jesus interact with people?
- → What does God want me to do as a result of reading this passage?

MATTHEW

This gospel was written by Matthew to Jews around AD 70. Mark looks at Jesus' life through what Jesus said. He highlights Jesus as King. As you read, watch for the often repeated phrase "Kingdom of heaven" and the emphasis on Jesus' words through His sermons.

Read each passage slowly. Ask God to speak to you from His Word. Read the passage a second time. Then ask:

- → What is this passage about?
- → What does it tell me about Jesus?
- → How did Jesus interact with people?
- → What does God want me to do as a result of reading this passage?

<u>JOHN</u>

This gospel was written by John to the church in AD 85 or sometime after. John focuses his gospel on who Jesus is. As you read, notice how often John uses the word "believe," as well as his focus on Jesus' teachings. John's gospel is different from the others in that he highlights Jesus' ministry in Judea, not Galilee.

Read each passage slowly. Ask God to speak to you from His Word. Read the passage a second time. Then ask:

- → What is this passage about?
- → What does it tell me about Jesus?
- → How did Jesus interact with people?
- → What does God want me to do as a result of reading this passage?
